Patek will join GRACE in April and assume the President role on July 1, 2011.

Green Bay Area Catholic Education (GRACE) System indicates that online registration is going well. Nearly 2000 K- 8 students and 300 early childhood students are registered for the ten GRACE schools. Families are strongly encouraged to register their children now since teacher staffing is based upon number of students in a class. Teacher contracts are scheduled to be given no later than April 15, but decisions are being made earlier in order to prepare the contracts.

The best marketers of our schools are the parents, who can speak highly of their school and the value of providing children with a beautiful Catholic faith, excellent academics, 21st century skills, extra-curricular programs and a stewardship way of life.

Employees of the parish schools will become GRACE employees with their new 2011-12 contracts.

GRACE is eager to welcome the teachers and support staff to the system.

Our new GRACE website provides information about our schools, registration, ways that people can support the students, various boards and committees, upcoming events and employment opportunities.

A GRACE Celebration Mass is planned June 28th at 5:00pm at St. Francis Xavier Cathedral. Bishop David Ricken will preside with GRACE priests concelebrating, deacons participating and school children serving in various roles in the Mass.

We want to fill Cathedral with families, employees, parishioners of our GRACE parishes and all who have ever worked to bring together the parishes and schools in the Green Bay area as a system.
